- (a) Attached to Task Force 74, H.M.A.S. SHROPSHIRE flag. Operating with Task Group 74.2, U.S.S. PHOENIX (ComCruDiv 15, OTC), U.S.S. NASHVILLE, DALY (CDS24), REALE and HUTCHINS.
- (b) Operating in accordance with CTF74 message 262326 of February.

(d) Underway enroute Admiralty Islands to Buna. 0429 Passed 2nd Echelon enroute to Admiralty Islands. 0645 PHOENIX, DALY and HUTCHINS proceeded to Cape Cretin, remainder of group continuing to Buna at 15 knots. 0948 PHOENIX, DALY and HUTCHINS rejoined. 1436 Anchored in Buna Roads and fueled.

- (b) Operating in accordance with CTF74 dispatch 020915 of March.

(d) Task Force passed to the northward of the Admiralty Islands at 2100 and entered patrol area. At this time enemy planes attacked destroyers patrolling near Manus Island about 20 miles away missing the AMMEN with four or five bombs by about 100 yards.

(d) Fatrolling in northern covering area. In accordance with Commander SEVENTH FIRET dispatch 032313 of March the Task Force closed the Admiralty Islands. All three cruisers plus the DALY and the HUTCHINS bombarded the eastern end of Hauwei Island in an attempt to knock out a battery of 3 inch guns covering the entrance to Seeadler Harbor. Later reports indicate this bombardment was not successful. The next day the NICHOLSON attempted to draw fire from these guns to see if they were still active. A 3 inch shell hit in number 2 handling room killing three men showed they were. At completion of bombardment the Task Force withdrew to the covering area.

Tuesday, 7 March 1944 (Cont'd)

Our target is a double purpose gun located on the eastern end of Koruniat Island. About ten miles from the islands we separated from the cruisers and proceeded at 30 knots to our firing area on course 140° T. Turned left to 110° T at 1637 and slowed to 20 knots running down a line that would put the target about 3500 yards abeam. 1645 Commenced firing on target area with 5 inch battery using direct fire, sweeping eastern end of island. 1650 Commenced firing with 40mm guns, firing for about 1 minute. Range was too great for accuracy against this kind of target with 40mm guns. 1650 Ceased firing with 5 inch battery. At 1700 reversed course opening fire again with main battery. At 1706 Ceased firing and turned to north to form anti-submarine screen on cruisers who had completed the refiring. After forming up the Task Force commenced return to Buna as directed by Commander SEVENTH FLEET.

PHOENIX. 1150 Carried out simulated torpedo attack with HEALE on PHOENIX. 1315 Commenced tracking drill with all guns on PHOENIX planes. 1520 Anchored in Buna Roads. 1820 Underway in accordance with orders from CTF74 in company with Task Force 74 enroute Milne Bay via coastal route.

At 1600 Red force consisting of SHROPSHIRE, HUTCHINS, BEALE, DALY and BACHE conducted simulated night contact and attack on Blue force consisting of NASHVILLE, PHOENIX, MULLANY and AMMEN. At conclusion cruisers formed scouting line patrolling to the southeast searching for U.S.S. BOISE coming up from the south. Destroyers formed line of section guides with sections in column about 20 miles behind cruisers.
